The Imminent Return of Christ

<u>1 Peter 4:7</u> The end of **all things** is near; therefore, be of sound judgment and sober *spirit* for the purpose of prayer.

<u>Philippians 4:5</u> Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. **The Lord** is near.

<u>James 5:8, 9b</u> You too be patient; strengthen your hearts, for **the coming of the Lord** is near...behold, the Judge is standing at the door.

Excursus: Jesus' Imminent Return	·
Mark 13:35-37 "Therefore, be on the alert—for	
you do not know when the master of the	
house is coming, whether in the evening, at	
midnight, or when the rooster crows, or in the morning— in case He should come suddenly	
and find you asleep. "What I say to you I say	
to all, 'Be on the alert!'"	
Luke 2:13 And suddenly there appeared with	
the angel a multitude of the heavenly host	
praising God	
The Apostolic View on Imminence	
"Primitive Christianity waits for the Jesus who	
has come already as the One who is still to	
come. The hope of an imminent coming of the	
exalted Lord in Messianic glory is, however, so	-
much to the fore that in the NT the terms	
(parousia) are never used for the coming of Christ in the flesh (incarnation)" (TDNT,	
Parousia, Vol 5, 865).	
The Definition of Imminence	
Imminence: An event that COULD happen at	
any moment – not that it MUST happen in any	
certain timeframe.	
Certainty: The event will happen and could at	
any moment.	
Uncertainty: The timing of the event.	
Overhanging Event	

Until Then: Love One Another 1 Peter 4:8-9 Above all, keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins. Be hospitable to one another without complaint.	
Use Your God Given Gifts For His Glory! 1 Peter 4:10-11 As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. Whoever speaks, is to do so as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves is to do so as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.	
Application 1. We should rejoice and prepare for the imminent return of Christ, not despair for the coming of the Anti-Christ. Titus 2:11-13 For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age, looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus.

Matt 24:7-8 For nation will rise against nation,

fully aware that the day of the Lord will come
