

The Apostolic Authority of Paul

<u>Colossians 1:1</u> Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timothy our brother.

- 1st Thessalonians 2:6 nor did we seek glory from men, either from you or from others even though as apostles of Christ we might have asserted our authority.
- 1. Apostles used generically as "messengers."
- 2. Timothy and Silas were apostles.
- Paul is using the "royal we."

<u>Colossians 1:2</u> To the saints and faithful brethren <u>in Christ</u> who are at Colossae: **Grace** to you and **peace** from God our Father.

- > Saints = 1. Elect Deut. 7:5-7; 1Cor. 1:2
 - 2. Believers Rom. 4:16; Jude 1:3
 - 3. Set apart Heb. 2:11
 - 4. Eternally Secure (persevere) John 10:27-29; Rev. 14:12
