Why the "least in the kingdom" have better status than the greatest prophet • 1Peter 1:12 It was revealed to them that they were not serving themselves, but you, in these things which now have been announced to you through those who preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven-things into which angels long to look.	
Those who repented "justified God" Luke 7:29 (NKJV) And when all the people heard Him, even the tax collectors justified God, having been baptized with the baptism of John.	
The common people saw themselves as sinners but the leaders would not Luke 7:30 But the Pharisees and the lawyers rejected God's purpose for themselves, not having been baptized by John.
