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A synagogue/Sabbath confrontation	-
■ <u>Luke 13:10, 11</u>	
And He was teaching in one of the	
synagogues on the Sabbath. And there	
was a woman who for eighteen years had had a sickness caused by a spirit; and she	
was bent double, and could not straighten	
up at all.	

	It was in a synagogue on Sabbath	
	that Jesus announced "release"	
	■ <u>Luke 4:18</u>	
	The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, Because He anointed Me to preach the gospel to	
	the poor. He has sent Me to proclaim release to the captives, And recovery of sight to the blind, To set free those who	
	are oppressed,	
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	This woman needs "release"	
	■ <u>Luke 13:10, 11</u>	
	And He was teaching in one of the	
	synagogues on the Sabbath. And there was a woman who for eighteen years had	
	had a sickness caused by a spirit; and she	
	was bent double, and could not straighten up at all.	
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	"Freed" = "Unloosed" in the Greek	
	■ <u>Luke 13:12, 13</u>	
	When Jesus saw her, He called her over	
	and said to her, "Woman, you are freed from your sickness." And He laid His	
	hands on her; and immediately she was made erect again and began glorifying	
	God.	

The official addresses his reasoning	
to the crowd	
■ <u>Luke 13:14</u>	
But the synagogue official, indignant because Jesus had healed on the Sabbath,	
began saying to the crowd in response, "There are six days in which work should	
be done; so come during them and get healed, and not on the Sabbath day."	
"Unloose" an ox but not a woman?	
■ <u>Luke 13:15, 16</u> (NKJV)	
The Lord then answered him and said,	
"Hypocrite! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or donkey from	
the stall, and lead <i>it</i> away to water it? So ought not this woman, being a daughter of	
Abraham, whom Satan has bound—think of it—for eighteen years, be loosed from this	
bond on the Sabbath?"	
Jesus fulfilled His promise of a ministry of release	
■ Acts 10:38	
You know of Jesus of Nazareth, how God	
anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and how He went about doing good	
and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.	

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The crowd sides with Jesus	
■ <u>Luke 13:17</u>	
As He said this, all His opponents were being humiliated; and the entire crowd was	
rejoicing over all the glorious things being	
done by Him.	_
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The kingdom has an inquarisions	
The kingdom has an inauspicious beginning	
■ <u>Luke 13:18, 19</u>	
So He was saying, "What is the kingdom	
of God like, and to what shall I compare it? It is like a mustard seed, which a man took	
and threw into his own garden; and it grew and became a tree, and the birds of the air	
nested in its branches."	
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The kingdom's small beginning	
■ <u>Luke 13:20, 21</u>	
And again He said, "To what shall I	
compare the kingdom of God? It is like leaven, which a woman took and hid in	
three pecks of flour until it was all leavened."	
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Implications and Applications	
Jesus "unlooses" people from Satan through the cross

by World Politico	
1) Jesus "unlooses" people from Satan through	
the cross	
■ <u>Colossians 2:14, 15</u>	
having canceled out the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us, which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the	
way, having nailed it to the cross. When He had disarmed the rulers and	
authorities, He made a public display of them, having triumphed over them through Him.	
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1) Jesus "unlooses" people from Satan through the cross	
■ <u>Hebrews 2:14, 15</u>	
Therefore, since the children share in	
flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death	
He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, and	
might free those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives.	

2) The kingdom gains citizens one soul at a time	
■ Colossians 1:13, 14 For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.	
2) The kingdom gains citizens one soul at a time	
■ <u>Acts 26:18</u>	
to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who have been sanctified by faith in Me.	
2) The kingdom gains citizens one soul at a time	
■ <u>Acts 26:19, 20</u>	
So, King Agrippa, I did not prove disobedient to the heavenly vision, but kept declaring both to those of Damascus first, and also at Jerusalem and then throughout all the region of Judea, and even to the Gentiles, that they should repent and turn to God, performing deeds appropriate to repentance.

■ <u>Romans 13:1</u>	
Every person is to be in subjection to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God.

■ <u>1Peter 2:13, 14</u>	
Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human institution, whether to a king as the one in authority, or to governors as sent by him for the punishment of	
evildoers and the praise of those who do right.

■ <u>Daniel 2:20, 21</u>	
Daniel said, "Let the name of God be blessed forever and ever, For wisdom and power belong to Him. It is He who changes the times and the epochs; He	
removes kings and establishes kings; He gives wisdom to wise men And knowledge to men of understanding."

■ Philippians 3:20, 21	
For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ; who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself.

"Whence to God alone we render worship, but in other things we gladly serve you, acknowledging you as kings and rulers of men, and praying that with your kingly power you be found to
