Women come looking for a body

■ Luke 24:1-3

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, bringing the spices which they had prepared. And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.

They lack understanding

■ Luke 24:4, 5

And it happened that while they were perplexed about this, behold, two men suddenly stood near them in dazzling apparel; and as the women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living One among the dead"?

The Road to Emmaus

■ Luke 24:13, 14

And behold, two of them were going that very day to a village named Emmaus, which was about seven miles from Jerusalem. And they were conversing with each other about all these things which had taken place.



Their Spiritual Eyes are Blinded

■ Luke 24:15, 16

And it came about that while they were conversing and discussing, Jesus Himself approached, and began traveling with them. But their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him.

Ironically he thinks Jesus is in the dark!	-

And He said to them, "What are these words that you are exchanging with one another as you are walking?" And they stood still,	-

And beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.

They unwittingly offer hospitality to Christ
