

### God's Grace Has Appeared

<u>Titus 2:11-12</u> For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men, instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age...

Jesus Is God Granville Sharp's Rule Applied To Titus 2:13 Article Substantive Kai Substantive (the) great God and Savior, Jesus Christ Same Person! Jesus: Our Redeemer Titus 2:14 ... who gave Himself for us to redeem us from every lawless deed, and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds.



#### Titus Is Under Apostolic Authority

<u>Titus 2:15</u> These things speak and exhort and reprove with all authority. Let no one disregard you.

### Application

- 1. The Messiah had to be fully God in order for us to be saved.
- 2. "Looking" for the blessed hope has been and will remain an imminent expectation until the rapture.

## The Christ Must Be Fully God To be our propitiation: Romans 3:25a (Christ)...whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation by His blood through faith. To be our righteousness: 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 5:19, 21...God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them...
